Come Join Us Holy Week

<u>Palm Sunday</u> starts Holy Week, and we as a church will reflect and pray on the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Jesus, at the Easter Triduum. I ask you to make every effort to join us on Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday.

Holy Thursday (at St. Patrick) we remember The Last Supper and the institution of the Eucharist at Mass. We will also celebrate the institution of Holy Orders, when Catholic priests all over the world renew their commitment to the Church and the Bishop. We also remember our call to service by the washing of feet as Jesus did at the Last Supper to show his disciples how they were to act as ministers and servants of God. This year we will not wash feet due to Covid; we will however, take a moment and reflect on God's call to service for us all.

Good Friday we gather (at Sacred Heart) to reflect on the Passion, Crucifixion and Death of Jesus on the cross. The church is bare, the tabernacle is empty, and we enter and leave in silent prayer. We will read the Passion, Venerate the Cross and receive Communion that was consecrated on Holy Thursday night. As we Venerate the Cross we reflect on our need for forgiveness of our sins and God's gift of Jesus, His Son, the sacrifice that redeems us. Good Friday night I ask you to join us (at St. Patrick) for a Healing Meditative Stations of the Cross. It will be a time to let Jesus into your hearts and minds and let Him heal what needs to be healed, forgive what needs to be forgiven, and fill you with the grace to move forward in your life, lighter and stronger for whatever comes.

Holy Saturday is the high point in the life to the Church. We begin (at St. Patrick) in darkness, because the light of Christ has been put in the tomb on Good Friday. We will bless the new fire, and praise God for the sacrifice of Christ, the Lamb of God, that brings light back into the world. The new Paschal candle is lit with the new fire and we share the flame to have it renew in our hearts and homes. We will renew our Baptismal promises and recommit ourselves to Christ by rejecting sin and accepting the freedom that comes from living as children of God. We then conclude with the celebration of Communion the Body and Blood of Christ. We will end the night in joy filled song, for the tomb is empty. The light of Christ is in the world, Alleluia, Jesus Christ is risen!! Join when you can, as much as you can, let Christ re-new and refresh you this **Holy** Week and Easter Season!
