## **Divine Mercy**

This weekend, the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Easter, is also known as Divine Mercy Sunday. St. Maria Faustina a Polish Nun was asked by Jesus to present to the world His Mercy. She had a vision of Christ dressed in white with Shining rays of Red and White coming from His Merciful Heart. She used all her free time, when she was not busy with the work she was assigned to in the convent, to write about the messages she received from Jesus about his Divine Mercy. She also was given the task by Jesus to teach us the Chaplet of Mercy. She was told by Jesus that anyone who prays the chaplet with trust in their hearts will have their prayers answered. Also that if someone prays or has someone praying for them at the time of their death, they will be forgiven their sins and would, by His love and mercy, enter in to eternal life. Saint Pope John Paul II instituted Divine Mercy Sunday as the Second Sunday of Easter because we read the Scriptures that tell us that when Jesus showed himself to his Disciples he did not condemn them for running out on him but showed them mercy and forgiveness. During this time of COVID19, it is fitting that we as a church gather and pray for the Grace, Mercy, Healing and forgiveness of God.

Please pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet for all in need of the all-powerful Grace and Mercy of God.
